Litter Lady Leads: in a Litter-filled Land by author Martha Goldner is a vivid and exquisitely illustrated children's picture book that celebrates an elderly woman's will to do the impossible and whose actions have a daily beneficial influence on the environment.

Lady Litter is shown as an elderly woman who is incredibly caring. The cane she uses to walk has a sharp tip that makes it easier for her to pick up rubbish that others have left behind. Because it is her greatest pleasure, she adores picking up litter regardless

of its kind or amount. She is the children's best friend and regularly treats them to delectable chocolate cookies. But because she needs to pick up a lot of litter every day, Lady Litter is unable to have fun.

A few pages into the story, the children are treated to no cookies. They are struck deeply by this, which motivates them to look for her. It is there they find a startling truth that leads them to make an essential but unexpected decision. This book is both educational and entertaining, all while addressing serious environmental concerns. It has an endearing protagonist who demonstrates the power of enthusiasm and who personifies what it means to take care of the environment. Because of her advanced age, it is easy to question what she is capable of, yet she pulls off the impossible. From the beginning, she sets the tone for what drive and concern may achieve, as well as the influence and motivation it can have on others. Her endearing demeanor and character make her an instant favorite among readers, who might wish to see her again in a follow-up.

Litter Lady Leads has been wonderfully executed. It cleverly draws attention to what may be accomplished with a collective effort to keep the environment clean. It makes use of simple language and brief phrases together with vibrant, self-explanatory pictures that young readers may easily understand. Given that this book covers every significant facet of environmental cleanliness, I really hope that educators will take notice. It would be a terrific addition to their schools' libraries.
